

Ordinance Number 10

An ordinance to provide for the care, custody, and preservation of the Public Property of the Village of Muir, to be known as Ordinance Number Ten.

The Village of Muir ordains:

Section I It shall not be lawful for any person to trespass upon, or in any manner interfere, meddle with, remove, disturb or destroy any of the corporate property of the Village of Muir, either real or personal.

Section II Any person who shall be judged guilty of a violation of this ordinance on conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than fifteen dollars, nor more than fifty dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail of Ionia County at hard labor not less than fifteen days nor exceeding fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court, and in case of the imposition of only a fine, the court shall make a further order that the offender upon default in the payment of such fine be committed to the county jail of Ionia County at hard labor until such fine is paid, provided, that such imprisonment shall not exceed a period of fifty days and in case both imprisonment and a fine and costs of prosecution is the penalty imposed such imprisonment may extend beyond the time of imprisonment designated in the sentence until such fine and costs are paid, not exceeding, however a period of fifty days after the time of the imprisonment imposed by the sentence shall have expired but both periods of imprisonment shall not exceed ninety days.
