AN ORDINANCE TO CONTROL AND REGULATE
THE ACCUMULATION AND DISPOSAL OF RUBBISH, TRASH, GARBAGE
AND OTHER REFUSE AND TO PROHIBIT THE BURNING OF
GRASS CLIPPINGS, LEAVES AND OTHER LIKE MATERIAL
WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF MUIR, MICHIGAN

THE VILLAGE OF MUIR ORDAINS:

- 1. No owner, tenant or lessee of any public or private premises shall permit the accumulation upon his or her premises of any rubbish, waste, trash, except grass clippings, leaves and general yard and garden waste.
- 2. Grass clippings, leaves and general yard and garden waste may be composted, if done so in an acceptable manner that does not produce odors offensive to surrounding properties and so long as such production is not offensive in view to surrounding properties or the street. Burning of leaves, grass clippings or other yard and garden waste shall be prohibited.
- 3. This Ordinance repeals any other ordinance, the terms of which are in conflict herewith.
- 4. Violation of this Ordinance is hereby designated as a civil infraction as defined by Section 600.113 of the Michigan Compiled Laws and is enforceable as provided is subsection 2 of said section provided that the penalty for such violation shall not exceed \$250.00.

#5 Recreational Fires: Recreational fires on private property are permitted and do not need Lyons-Muir Lyons Township Fire Department approval when in a pit or pile which does not exceed five (5) foot in diameter provided the following conditions are met:

- A. Fires are attended until extinguished and ashes are cold.
- B. Only clean wood products or commercially produced fuel products are burnt.
- C. The fire does not endanger other buildings or structures.
- D. Atmospheric conditions are favorable.
- E. Prohibit emission of smoke or fumes which irritate, annoy or constitute a nuisance to others living in the neighborhood.

#6 Exceptions ans Special Circumstances: Open fires are permitted in the performance of an official duty by public officer for fires necessary for one or more of the following reasons or purposes:

- A. For the prevention of a fire hazard which cannot be abated by other means.
- B. For the instruction of public fire fighters or industrial commercial employees under proper supervision of a qualified instructor.
- C. For the protection of pubic health.
- D. For controlled disposal of refuse and debris as collected by or on behalf of the Village of Muir as a site owned or operated by the village.
