VILLAGE COUNCIL NEWS

The large water main and street project is winding down. Contractors are in the final punch list stage. There have been issues with getting the service lines restored. Please be aware that the Village is working diligently with the engineer on getting compliance from the contractor. If you still have issues in October, let the office know.

Total debt incurred was \$1,457,000 through USDA at 1.75% over 40 years in the Water Fund. A previous loan was paid off in the Water Fund in April 2021. No rate increase in water was necessary this year because of the restructuring of debt. Some extra street work was paid for through the street funds. Muir was fortunate to get good surfaces on almost every street in town. The DPW garage received an upgraded parking lot and the cemetery driveways were paved. The Village applied for a grant from MEDC for the sewer lift station and force main. Unfortunately our project was not chosen this year but, with feedback from MEDC, we will apply again for the next round.

We will be renewing the Recreation Grant this spring as part of a Master Plan for the village. Having a Master Plan enables more grant opportunities. The village continues to apply for Recreation Grants to enhance the park along the trail.

The village has been working to get the speed limit lowered back down to at least 45 mph on M21. Meetings with MDOT have not gone in our favor so far. Be assured that the council knows the hazards but are at the mercy of MDOT and their decision.
